Our prime aim of our education is to reach the most disadvantaged children belonging to SC, ST social groups who have migrated from other states and those who do not know to read and write. The government school doesn't have the facilities and therefore children get disoriented. Through Our school we motivate the parents or the children to make them aware of their basic right to get education.

All the migrating children are admitted into the hostel and go to school every day. Everything is provided in the hostel. Children get up in the morning at 5.30am and having their morning wash they begin their morning studies with yoga for 15 minutes. They study up to 7.45 am and go for breakfast. The school begins at 9am and breaks for lunch at 12.45. The classes resume at 1.30 and ends by 4.15 pm. Then the children have games and sports followed by washing. The evening study begins at 6pm and goes on up to 7.30 pm. After the dinner the children have some recreation and begin their study again at 8.30pm which goes on up to 10pm by then they go to sleep. The slow learners have coaching classes in the evening hours. Their weight is measured every month and record is maintained to monitor their physical growth. Their education is measured by the marks obtained by the students in every test and examinations that they attend. Their progress in studies is also shared with their parents. Learning materials like note books and other stationery items like toilet articles are given to all children periodically as per their need.

Activity 3

Providing hygienic and nutritious food

Food items	Darsi
Rice and vegetable and dhall	Every noon meal rice, vegetable, and dhall. Every night meal rice, vegetable and Rasam with Tamarind or Tomato

On an average 80% of the children increased in their weight.

Activity 4: Providing quality education.

The teaching staffs of the school are committed to provide quality education to the poor children who are the first generation to attend schooling. Regular classes are conducted for the children. The slow learners are given special coaching in the evening times. Weekly tests, monthly tests, and quarterly exams are conducted regularly to evaluate the progress of the children in their education. On an average, 95% of the children have improved in their education.

In the month of March 2015, 67 boys and girls wrote the X class final examinations and out of which 64 children passed in the public examinations. I present below the mark list of the children.
